

READY TO LEARN AT ST MATTHEW'S

This term, we will all be focusing on the concept of 'Health and Wellbeing'. Classrooms will be full of learning surrounding how we keep ourselves healthy, going beyond the need for physical health but also exploring the importance for spiritual and mental health. This term will be spent setting up classroom expectations to promote health and wellbeing as well as looking beyond the classroom and into the playground, ensuring that we create spaces where everyone feels that they belong and are looked after by their peers. 


Very happy members of the 2019 St Matthew's PS SRC after being presented with their badges at Assembly last Friday.

MATHEMATICS AT ST MATTHEW'S



The "highest achievers in the world are those who focus on big ideas in mathematics, and connections between ideas" (Jo Boaler, Stanford, 2015). Approaching big ideas through inquiry based learning links mathematical concepts and uncovers real world mathematics. Deep learning occurs in mathematics when students are engaged in genuine reasoning, develop persistence and have the opportunity to apply their learning in a meaningful situation. At St Matthew's we are incredibly lucky to have a rich supply of technological resources and we are able to develop a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics) approach to Mathematics.


Mathematics at St Matthews is about;

- learner independence, persistence, motivation and confidence
- opportunities for innovation and exploration
- encouraging flexibility and mental agility
- focussing on concepts rather than procedures
- making growth not grades
- using rich tasks that enable higher order thinking skills
- making connections in mathematics and the real world
- using games (such as Mangahigh) to practice skills
- developing productive communication and teamwork

Working in pairs or groups is an important part of learning to work mathematically. Students will work in different ways throughout the course of the year. Sometimes they will choose their own partners and sometimes the teachers will group students according to their learning needs. This may occur in student's own classroom or across the whole year level. Students who need extra support may work with a Learning Support Officer and those working above grade level will be given additional challenges.

We encourage you to work with your child at home by being involved in his or her homework and projects. One of the most important gifts you can give your child is to include them in the ways you use mathematics in your daily life. This includes cooking, shopping, budgeting, home renovations or repairs, planning a holiday, planning a car trip, looking at sports statistics, etc. Mathematics really is everywhere!


