### PARENTS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT MOMO

It has been brought to my notice that some students at St Matthew's have viewed Momo online and have been scared. Please read an excerpt that explains in basic terms about it. The original tale said a character with bulging eyes would "hack" into WhatsApp and set children dangerous "challenges" such as harming themselves. But the image is now being shared on social media simply to frighten children. It has been found edited into unofficial copies of children's cartoons such as Peppa Pig on YouTube.

Fact-checking website Snopes suggested the story was "far more hype or hoax than reality", but warned the images could still cause distress to children.

The image of Momo is actually a photo of a sculpture by Japanese special-effects company Link Factory. The reason I am telling parents this is so that parents monitor their child's screen time and what they are getting online to. It is in your hands.



### What's Been Happening at EXTEND?


Last week we done few simple science experiments at Extend in a fun way to introduce children of all ages to basic scientific concepts. We started our week with Lemon Volcanoes experiment. We prepared lemon and sliced the bottom so they could sit flat then slice out the core.

Next, we squeeze out lemon juice from a second lemon that we prepare and set aside. Everyone got to choose the colour they like and place a few drops in the centre of lemon, then added a spoonful of baking soda into the lemon which made the lemon started to fizz! Woohooo! Everyone then pours the lemon juice into the lemon then tadaaaa! Lemon volcanoes erupted! We even stick our whole hand in the lemon and give it a good squeeze! It is so fun! We then tried water bag without leaking experiment.

We fill the zip lock bag with half full water then seal the bag. Then everyone has a pencil on hand and ready to poke it. We fail the first few times as we did not poke the water bag in right position or not quick enough. However, we did not want to give up then we succeeded at the fifth times! We were so excited! The water bag was full of water and pencil through it, but it was not leaking! How amazing is that! It is just like magic!

We should try different kind of bag such as thicker plastic bag next time for further experiment. The rest of the week we tried other experiment such as walking water rainbow, candle experiment and we will have more experiments coming soon! 
