So get on board for what will be another eventful ride.

NEW DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

Our new Deputy Principal Mrs Carmela D'Amato will be starting with us in Week 3 on Monday 30th July. We are very excited to have her joining St Matthew's staff. Mrs D'Amato was in during the holidays meeting with both Mrs Hocking and myself as part of a thorough handover and transition to our school in preparation for her start here.

Also we have a new teacher who is replacing Mrs Camille Voce in 2VF, Ms Nicola Howard has done a fair bit of relieving as an emergency teacher at St Matthew's and we were thrilled to be able to gain her services until the end of the year

I know that you all will make both ladies feel very welcome, just as you did when Mrs Hocking and I were both new to the school. I also know that is something that the Students and Parents are very good at doing to everyone who is new to our school.

OUTSTANDING FEES

Statements for outstanding fees were sent home on Monday via your child's schoolbag. Your current outstanding balance needs to be paid by the last week of this term commencing Monday 17th September.

There are multiple options available for payment of school fees:

- * Cash, Cheque, Eftpos or Creditcard at the School Office;
- * Direct deposit of funds into our bank account;
- * A weekly, fortnightly or monthly direct debit arrangement;
- * Or if necessary, credit card payments can be taken over the phone.

If the outstanding fees are not paid, the debt will be referred to Waterman's Receivables in Term 4.

As you may be aware Waterman's have already been concentrating on families that have had fees outstanding from last year. If you are in this category they should have contacted you already. Thank you to those families who have now paid their outstanding balances.

Can I remind parents that St Matthew's is like any other Catholic school where parents have to pay fees if they wish to send their children here. Unfortunately some parents have been neglecting their commitment to doing this, hence why we have contracted Waterman's.

If we compare neighbouring Catholic schools (see below) and what they are charging then it is obvious that we supply your children with an excellent education with extensive facilities and resources for a cost far less than most of these schools. At St Matthew's ~ Family Fees = \$1,050 (per family) & Individual Student Levy = \$330 This is something I have deliberately done as a Principal, because I want to be able to offer a Catholic Education affordable to as many catholic families as possible.

If you are experiencing financial strain or genuine hardship, please make a time to speak with me during this term before your account is referred to Waterman's.

STUDENT ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL

A reminder once again that all students need to be at school by 8:50am sharp at the very latest to commence their school day in their grade at 9:00am so that they are not behind in their learning right from the start of the day

If students arrive after 9:00am they will be required to come via the office and register on our VPass IPad just as all visitors, tradesmen and casual relief teachers do so that we have an electronic record of their attendance at school for that day.

After the roll has been taken in each classroom electronically at the beginning of the day it is then checked in the office by our Admin staff – by either Lina, Zina, Almoza or Nicole. If there are any students absent either of these ladies will then ring their parents for an explanation as to why they are away from school. If your child is away you can avoid this phone call by registering your child's absence on our Skoolbag App or calling the school by 8:45am before school starts.

As all gates will now be locked at 9:00am at the very latest parents need to start leaving after the first bell at 8:50am. If the gates are locked and Parents are still in the schoolyard they will then need to leave through the Office door.

Please Note: All these procedures are now directives from Catholic Education Melbourne and the Department of Education as a result of our Child Safety Policy and we are mandated to enforce them.

GRADE 6 SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

The candidates have been busy learning about the Sacrament and getting ready for this important step with the support of their other classmates and teachers.

The 29 Confirmation candidates will receive the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit which are: Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear of the Lord (Wonder). They also receive the Fruits of the Holy Spirit which are Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self-Control.



NEW ARCHBISHOP OF MELBOURNE / CHANGES FOR CONFIRMATION

We have been informed by the Archdiocese of Melbourne that Most Reverend Archbishop Denis Hart is retiring after 17 years as Archbishop of Melbourne and that His Holiness, Pope Francis has appointed *Bishop Peter Andrew Comensoli* of the Diocese of Broken Bay, New South Wales as the next Archbishop of Melbourne. Bishop Comensoli will become the 9th Archbishop of Melbourne.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR THE CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION AT ST MATTHEW'S?

Due to Archbishop Hart retiring, he will no longer celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation at St Matthew's this year as previously planned. Archbishop-Elect Peter Comensoli will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation Without Mass on the same day and time. The term, 'without mass' essentially means that the Sacrament of Confirmation at St Matthew's this year will become a Liturgy without 'The Liturgy of the Eucharist' (Communion) and without some important prayers normally recited. This is a directive from the Archdiocese of Melbourne.

An Outline of the Sacrament of Confirmation Liturgy is as follows:

- 1. The Introductory Rites
- 2. The Celebration of the Word of God (includes readings, homily and presentation of the candidates)
- 3. The Renewal of Baptismal Promises (for the candidates)
- 4. The Laying on of Hands
- 5. The Anointing With Chrism (candidates come forward to receive the Sacrament with the support of their Sponsor)
- 6. Prayers of the Faithful
- 7. The Recitation of The Lord's Prayer
- 8. Final Blessing / Prayer Over the People

Please keep the Year 6 Confirmation Candidates in your prayers over the coming weeks as they commence Confirmation preparation. The celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation will take place on Friday, 10th August at 6:00pm.

The Passport is to be handed in before the commencement of the mass. The Passport will be returned signed at the conclusion of the mass.

STUDENT WELLBEING NEWS

WHY SCREEN TIME BEFORE BED IS BAD FOR CHILDREN - PART 1:

Sleep is an essential part of our development and wellbeing. It is important for learning and memory, emotions and behaviours, and our health more generally. Yet the total amount of sleep that children and adolescents are getting is continuing to decrease. Why?

Although there are potentially many reasons behind this trend, it is emerging that screen time – by way of watching television or using computers, mobile phones and other electronic mobile devices – may be having a <u>large and negative impact</u> on children's sleep.

Electronic devices intrude on time for sleep

The presence and use of these devices is incredibly widespread. A 2006 <u>survey</u> showed that nearly all adolescents have at least one electronic device in their bedroom. Given this, and the increasing exposure to screen time – particularly in the hours before bedtime – it is perhaps not surprising that screen time is now associated with insufficient and poor quality sleep.

A 2014 review found consistent evidence that sleep was hampered by screen time, primarily in relation to shortened sleep duration and a delay in the timing of sleep. The latter finding was reported in 90% of the studies reviewed. But the relationship between screen time and sleep is more complex than that. Screen time could be negatively influencing sleep in many ways.

The timing of screen time is one important factor. The use of these devices can lead to <u>delays</u> in the time that children and adolescents go to bed and, consequently, shorter sleep overall. These negative impacts on sleep can be due to screen time in the evening cutting into the time that children would normally be preparing for bed and sleeping, delaying sleep onset and reducing the overall duration of sleep. There is simply less time available for it.

There will then be adequate time dedicated for Q&A.





Kids gamed

Child data stolen, sold

CHILDREN'S data, including email addresses, phone numbers and passwords, is being sold online after being stolen from gaming websites such as Fortnite and Minecraft.

Cyber-criminals are selling "data sets" of children's personal information for as little as \$15 on the dark web — a hidden part of the internet known for illegal activity.

Federal Law Enforcement and Cyber Security Minister Angus Taylor is planning new laws to crack down on criminals using gaming applications to exploit children.

Datasets advertised for sale online included passwords and email addresses for gaming accounts and phone numbers obtained from social media site Snapchat.

Security in Depth chief executive Michael Connory, who has provided cyber security advice to the government, said the sale of children's data online was a growing trend.

"We've found over the past 18 months the number of children's IDs being advertised for sale has grown substantially.

"The advantage to having children's ID is that it's far more usable for someone to perpetrate long-term identity theft. It's unlikely a child will look at their credit history, or if they're applying for loans or setting up bank accounts."

He said there were also fears paedophiles could use the data for grooming purposes.

Cyber safety expert Ross Bark said criminals could use a child's username and password for a gaming site to extract more data, including phone numbers, credit card details, birthdates and home address.

"Websites like Fortnite ask users to hand over a lot of personal information, which is very valuable to criminals," Mr Bark said.

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
