NDIS Information

The National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) information for students who live in Hume Moreland (HUME) in receipt of the following programs/supports:

- Students with disability transport program (Specialist School Bus, taxi or conveyance allowance); and/or
- Personal care support at school (Program for Students with Disabilities (PSD) funding at level 4, 5 or 6; and/or Medical Intervention Support (MIS)).
- Students receiving PSD funding for Vision Impairment ·
- Students enrolled at a Specialist School exclusively for students with Moderate to Profound Intellectual Disability

How do I know if my child is eligible for NDIS?

From October 2016, students in receipt of these programs/supports can access the NDIS if they meet the age, residency and disability requirements. If your child meets the disability requirements and you live in Hume Moreland which is the following Local Government Areas outlined below, your child may be able to access the scheme.

- Hume
- Moreland

When will parents be contacted?

From September 2018 the NDIA will phone you or send you a letter to begin the initial paperwork.

What do I need to do after the NDIA contacts me?

As the NDIS may fund supports and services in addition to what your child is currently receiving at school we encourage you to respond to the NDIA as soon as they get in touch.

It is important to note the NDIS does not fund supports that relate to your child's learning. These will still be the responsibility of schools and the education system.

If your child is eligible for the NDIS, you will be asked to work with the NDIA to develop a plan which will identify the services and support best suited to your child.

What will change and what won't?

Your child will be assessed for need and may be eligible for a range of supports. For now, your child's bus to school and support for personal care needs at school will continue to be delivered in the same way. If there are changes to arrangements in the future these will be gradual and we will talk to you first. For now there is no change.

What if my child isn't receiving personal care or transport?

If you live in Hume Moreland and your child is not currently receiving these services through the Victorian Government, and you believe they might be eligible for the NDIS, we encourage you to approach the NDIA to be assessed. You can contact the NDIA on 1800 800 110.

What if I don't live in Hume Moreland?

The NDIS is transitioning across Victoria, Local Government Area by Local Government Area from 1 July 2016 to 30 June 2019.

This week the Prep students were visited by guest speaker, one of our Dads, Constable Bradley Proud (Zachary 3PW & Timothy PL) to further explore their Inquiry topic of 'Keeping Happy, Safe and Healthy'. Constable Proud was able to touch on a variety of the topics covered throughout the Preps Inquiry unit, as well as providing other insights into how students could apply this knowledge into real life and practical situations. This included educating the students on the features of the Victorian Police uniform, so that they are able to correctly identify a police officer when they require assistance, providing students with various scenarios and how to best approach each problem, as well as strategies to stay calm in situations where they might feel scared or anxious.

Thank you to both Bradley and Anna Proud for their involvement and for making our Inquiry topic come to life. It was a great learning experience for all involved.

Victorian Premier's Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and St Matthew's is excited to be participating.

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition, but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 7 September 2018.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and can choose to have their name included on the online Honour Roll. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Definitions: *Department* refers to the Victorian Department of Education and Training, *Person* refers to the child/adult listed below in the consent declaration.

1) Privacy Protection

The Department takes its privacy obligations seriously and any personal information collected or used by the Department will be handled in accordance with the *Privacy and Data Protection Act 2014* (Vic). This law sets out what we must do when the Department collects, uses, handles and destroys personal information. Personal information includes personal details such as an individual's name and school that could be used to identify an individual.

2) Collection, use, disclosure and storage of personal information

If you provide your consent your school will collect and disclose your child's first and last name, and the name of the school to the Department. The Department will then:

Publish your child's name on its online Honour Roll located at: www.education.vic.gov.au/prc at the completion of the Challenge with no other identifying factors such as early childhood setting name.

3) Accuracy, access to information and withdrawal of consent

The Department will endeavour to ensure that any personal information held about your child is up to date and accurate. You can access, correct and withdraw personal information held by the Department by written request in accordance with the Department's Information Privacy Policy located at: http://www.education.vic.gov.au/Pages/privacypolicy.aspx

NATIONAL DISABILITY INSURANCE SCHEME

INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES OF STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES HUME MORELAND AREA

The National Disability Insurance Scheme (NOIS) is a new, national approach providing individualised support and services for people with disability. The NDIS is administered by the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA).

The NDIS commenced operation in some parts of the State on 1 July 2016 and will rollout progressively across the remainder of the State, Area by Area, until it is fully operational on 1 July 2019. Key information for Hume Moreland is as follows:

Area start date	Local government areas	Local Area Coordinator
1 March 2018	Hume, Moreland	Brotherhood of St Laurence

Participants will transition to the NDIS based on where they live, not where they attend school.

Eligibility is focused on lifelong, functional impairment. NDIS eligibility information is available on the NDIS Access Checklist which is on the NDIS website.

There are two possible pathways for students with a disability to access the NDIS:

- Students who are receiving specified disability programs or supports will have their details
 automatically provided to the NDIA. Your school will be able to advise you if your child is receiving
 one of these supports. These students may be contacted by the NDIA up to six months prior to their
 Area's start date and invited to test their eligibility for the scheme.
- Students who do not receive any of the specified programs or supports can directly contact either the NDIA or the NDIA Local Area Coordinator to test their eligibility. This can commence up to six months prior to their Area's rollout date.
