#### **NDIS Information**

The National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) information for students who live in Hume Moreland (HUME) in receipt of the following programs/supports:

- Students with disability transport program (Specialist School Bus, taxi or conveyance allowance); and/or
- Personal care support at school (Program for Students with Disabilities (PSD) funding at level 4, 5 or 6; and/or Medical Intervention Support (MIS)).
- Students receiving PSD funding for Vision Impairment ·
- Students enrolled at a Specialist School exclusively for students with Moderate to Profound Intellectual Disability

#### How do I know if my child is eligible for NDIS?

From October 2016, students in receipt of these programs/supports can access the NDIS if they meet the age, residency and disability requirements. If your child meets the disability requirements and you live in Hume Moreland which is the following Local Government Areas outlined below, your child may be able to access the scheme.

- Hume
- Moreland

#### When will parents be contacted?

From September 2018 the NDIA will phone you or send you a letter to begin the initial paperwork.

#### What do I need to do after the NDIA contacts me?

As the NDIS may fund supports and services in addition to what your child is currently receiving at school we encourage you to respond to the NDIA as soon as they get in touch.

It is important to note the NDIS does not fund supports that relate to your child's learning. These will still be the responsibility of schools and the education system.

If your child is eligible for the NDIS, you will be asked to work with the NDIA to develop a plan which will identify the services and support best suited to your child.

#### What will change and what won't?

Your child will be assessed for need and may be eligible for a range of supports. For now, your child's bus to school and support for personal care needs at school will continue to be delivered in the same way. If there are changes to arrangements in the future these will be gradual and we will talk to you first. For now there is no change.

#### What if my child isn't receiving personal care or transport?

If you live in Hume Moreland and your child is not currently receiving these services through the Victorian Government, and you believe they might be eligible for the NDIS, we encourage you to approach the NDIA to be assessed. You can contact the NDIA on 1800 800 110.

#### What if I don't live in Hume Moreland?

The NDIS is transitioning across Victoria, Local Government Area by Local Government Area from 1 July 2016 to 30 June 2019.

#### > Michael Grose's Parenting Ideas:

#### **Topic Three: Good Kids**

*Discipline is one of the most important parts of parenting.* It's about keeping kids safe, making them social and enhancing their chances of success. It's also about getting more cooperation from kids. Discipline is easy if you have easy kids or they are in an easy stage of development. But getting cooperation from kids who are challenging, going through a 'difficult' stage or who have difficult temperaments is a real discipline challenge for many parents. Get it right and family-life is a breeze. Don't have a plan and parenting can be a constant struggle.

#### Well-behaved kids

Effective parents use a broad range of strategies to promote appropriate behaviours and change behaviour when it's less than perfect.

They also use strategies that are in line with modern teaching and child care methods ... so smacking is out, but consequences, behaviour rehearsal and other forms of teaching kids to behave well are in.

#### Keep the following five principles in mind as you teach your kids to behave well:

- 1. Avoid the first impulse when kids misbehave. Most children's misbehaviour has a pay-off, so it's important to change yourself, if you are going to change your children's misbehaviour.
- 2. The more time you spend teaching kids to behave well the less time you'll spend responding to poor behaviour.
- 3. Kids want good A-grade attention from parents. If they don't get it they will settle for B-grade every time. Make sure you spend 1-on-1 time with kids each day, and get better at catching them doing the right thing.
- 4. When you get tired you revert to your lowest level of parenting technique, so if that means yelling to get cooperation then that's what you'll do. The key is to practise better techniques when you aren't stressed, so that when you do get tired your responses will be better.
- Effective parents have a big repertoire of strategies to use when kids misbehave, rather than rely on one or two techniques to improve behaviour. Build your repertoire of tools and language to promote better behaviour and get cooperation from kids.

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and St Matthew's is excited to be participating.
