

UPDATE ON RENOVATIONS TO ADMINISTRATION

The Building contract will be signed next Monday afternoon. Soon after this the builders will come on site and renovations will be commencing. Last Term an alert was sent through Skoolbag App letting families know that our front office will no longer be accessible and the new office entrance will be operational instead. Parents, staff, students and visitors can only access the front office in the following way:

REMINDERS:

BEFORE & AFTER SCHOOL: The double gates at the front of the school will not be accessible as this will be the building site entrance. The entrance to the Parish carpark will be the entrance to the school. Everyone will need to walk through the double gates onto the Asphalt area into school. LOWSON St and SELOLA Court will still be accessible. The Drop Off and Pick Up area will remain the same at the front of the school however; the students will need to walk through the church carpark.

LATE ARRIVALS and LATE PICKUP: Students should be at school by 8.45, ready to start the school day at 8.50am. Any students arriving after 9am should be taken to the LOWSON St entrance so that they can be signed in. At the end of the school day, all students should be picked up by 3.45pm at the latest. If you are arriving later than this, you will need to pick your child up from the LOWSON St office.

DURING SCHOOL TIME: The only entrance will be through one open gate at LOWSON St. Students and Parents will need to proceed through the carpark and the single gate at the end to the Senior building. There will be a doorbell to ring to let the office staff know that there is someone there. Further double gates and a single gate have been installed to prevent people moving further into the school. The Visual Arts room has now become the Administration Office and the former Wellbeing Office is Mr Brown and Mrs D'Amato's combined office. The Staffroom is now in the Family Room along with the Playgroup.

ENROLMENTS

Enrolments for 2020 are now opened. If you have a younger son or daughter who turns 5 years old before April 30th 2020 then they are eligible to enrol. If you have relatives or friends from kinder let them know about our amazing school and get them to come to the office to pick up an enrolment form.

On Wednesday afternoon the whole school gathered in the church to commemorate ANZAC (Australian and New Zealand army Corps) Day.
