# PLEASE NOTE ~ YOUR CHILD'S SAFETY IS A PRIORITY AT ST MATTHEW'S LOWSON STREET

Parents there are a few directives regarding Lowson Street that all parents need to adhere to:

- 1. Only Staff and deliveries are allowed to drive into the Staff Car Park. Parents need to park in Lowson Street. If parents continue to park in the Staff Car Park their cars will be towed away. This will then mean they incur a cost to get their car back.
- 2. Parents can only park on the School Side of Lowson Street at all times. There are parking restriction signs on the opposite side of the road. If you choose to park on the wrong side during these restrictions you will receive a hefty fine from the Moreland City Council
- 3. So please for your Children's Safety and your financial status do the right thing and no one will get hurt or angry.

#### WILLIAM STREET -

It is quite obvious that a lot more parents are using Lowson Street instead of William Street to drop off their children, which is causing the congestion mentioned above.

This is extremely dangerous as there is no School Crossing or Crossing Supervisor in Lowson St. I think a number of parents are doing this because they are concerned that their children have to walk past the old School Double gates to the Parish Car Park and they cannot see them go into school.

Once the Building Site Fencing is erected we will be moving the Drop Off Zone to the south side of the School Crossing (Before the School Crossing). The cones and sign will be along the grass nature strip and past the Parish Car park entrance for the children to be picked up & dropped off.

#### **REMINDER - SELOLA COURT -**

TO ALL PARENTS WHO DROP OFF OR PICK UP YOUR CHILDREN IN SELOLA COURT. SELOLA COURT ENTRANCE WILL BE CLOSED FROM APPROXIMATELY WEDNESDAY 22<sup>ND</sup> MAY DUE TO THE CONSTRUCTION & INSTALLATION OF A LIFT NEXT TO THE STAIRWELL. This whole area will be closed off extensively until work is completed. Thanking you for your cooperation.

#### **REMINDER - ENROL NOW FOR ALL GRADE LEVELS IN 2020**

Enrolments for 2020 for all grades are now open. If you have a younger son or daughter who turns 5 years old before April 30<sup>th</sup> 2020 then they are eligible to enrol for prep. There are also a few vacancies in all other grade levels If you have relatives or friends from kinder let them know about our amazing school and get them to come to the office to pick up an enrolment form.

#### **REMINDER - WINTER SCHOOL UNIFORM**

After two years of fazing in our new Winter School Uniform it is now mandatory that all students are wearing the full Winter School Uniform and the proper School Sports Uniform. There should be no skivvies, no Grey Jumpers & no old Polo shirts. Also all students should be wearing black school shoes, not black runners or black soft shoes. Runners only on Sport days with our Sport Uniform. We have a most impressive and striking uniform, let's be proud of it and wear the right garments. #### **REMINDER - LATEST UPDATE ON RENOVATIONS TO ADMINISTRATION**

This afternoon the Building contract was finalised by Father Boy representing the Parish, myself representing the St Matthew's PS, our Architect Stuart Harrison, the Builders "**NEWPOL**", a representative from the Archdiocese of Melbourne and also one from Catholic Education Melbourne. Hopefully next week the builders will come on site and renovations will start commencing. Last Term an alert was sent through Skoolbag App letting families know that our front office will no longer be accessible and the new office entrance in the Senior Building will be operational instead.

#### **2F KEEPING HEALTHY**

In Term 1, our Inquiry unit was about keeping healthy. We re-arranged our classroom to help our spiritual, mental and physical wellbeing.

We changed our **Reading Corner** to help our mental and spiritual health. We have included Religion books so we can read about God. We also included funny books, to make us laugh when we are feeling sad.

We came up with **classroom rules** to help our mental and physical wellbeing when we are in the classroom. We made these rules to keep ourselves and others happy and safe. One of these rules was Stop, Think and Do.

We created a **Relaxation Station** to make people feel happy, relaxed and calm. We added teddy bears to hug when we are feeling sad as well as squishy toys to help us relax when we are angry.

We created a **Spiritual Space** to help our spiritual wellbeing. We added a prayer tree to hang prayers on when we want to talk to God or Jesus. We also included prayer books and a prayer roster for our daily prayer time.

Lastly, we made posters for children who have allergies or anaphylaxis. We spread awareness about the dangers to keep those children safe.

We made these changes to make our classroom safer and a more relaxing space to learn in.

#### **COMMUNION PASSPORT (YEAR 4 FAMILIES):**

A reminder to all parents and children in Year 4 who are receiving the Sacrament of First Communion on Sunday, 3<sup>rd</sup> June that your passport is required to be completed by Sunday, 20<sup>th</sup> May. Three weekend masses need to be attended prior to the sacrament day. It is very important that you bring your passport with you and have the Parish Priest sign their name as well as writing the name of the Parish (if outside St Matthew's) at the conclusion of the mass. Once your child has attended three weekend masses they will then be required to hand their passport in to Mr Brown for him to sign and keep a record.
