Dear Students, Parents, Staff and Friends of St Matthew's,

Last Thursday the leadership team attended the Northern Zone leadership mass where we were commissioned as leaders into our schools. It was a wonderful opportunity to gather with other school leaders and to listen to the words of Fr Luciano who spoke about the call to each of us as educators. He spoke about being called to connect, be kind and act. Those words resonated strongly with what we as educators want for our community of students and parents. We want each of us to be available to connect with what is occurring in the world around us, to be kind when dealing with each other and to go forward and put into action what it is we have learnt for the good of the community. In the daily readings for this week, we read about Jesus' commandment to love one another. We are to love as Jesus loves, not selectively, but with a love that extends to all people. This kind of love will be a sign that they are truly his disciples and that he is still living in them. The love that we are asked to give is also an act of connecting to the world around us and being aware of how people might need us.

Through our inquiry Big Questions this term, we are also looking at how we can physically help those around us, not just through love but also through action. Our classrooms are full of learning about how we can innovate on items and processes already in place to help those around us right now. A BIG QUESTION for all of us is: *How can we fulfil the call to love and to help those around us?*

Please remember to keep the Year 4 children in your thoughts and prayers as they prepare to receive Jesus' body in the Eucharist for the first time.




