RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Shrove Tuesday, Ash Wednesday and Lent

Shrove Tuesday comes from an old English translation which means "to confess" or "wash away" our sins. It is the day before Ash Wednesday the first day of Lent –a time that would end 40 days and 40 nights later on Easter Sunday. Many, many years ago it was important to use all the eggs, sugar, butter and dairy which were usually given up during Lent time. This is why making pancakes is the best as it uses all those ingredients with a little flour.

Lent is also the time when we make more of an effort to Pray, Fast and Giving. These three spiritual practices are very important during the Lenten season. We need to pray more during this time and make an effort to speak to God through Prayer. Fasting means going without or eating something you would like to eat a lot of. For example giving up chocolate! Giving means thinking about others and how we can help, can we add a gold coin to the Project Compassion box? Give clothing we no longer need to the poor? Or even give our time to those who need our help. What will you choose to do this Lent?

On *Ash Wednesday,* the very first day of Lent - we have a special mass – at 10.30am and the teachers this year will put a cross from blessed ashes (these are usually the palms that were used the previous year's Palm Sunday) on our foreheads.

The cross that is made on our forehead helps us to remember that Jesus died on the cross for all of us and to remember our sins – what we truly feel sorry for.



ORIENTEERING PROGRAM

We are very excited to let you know that the Year 4, 5 and 6 students will be participating in orienteering sessions throughout the remainder of Term 1. Orienteering is part treasure hunt, part amazing race. It is as much a mental activity as a physical one. It can be conducted outdoors and indoors and it caters for all levels of fitness, for walkers as well as runners.

The program teaches students orienteering skills using a variety of active, fun and inclusive games. Some of the skills students will learn include reading maps, map symbols, orientating the map (cardinal points/NESW) and route choice. The program concludes with an orienteering line course around the school.

Orienteering is a fantastic way to give students skills in Mathematics and Physical Education as well as developing team building and problem solving.

You can download Seesaw's Parent App for iOS, Android, or use the web to view your child's learning. When your child adds new work, you will receive a notification to see, hear and respond with a like and a positive comment to your child's learning item.

You only have access to your own child's work and all of the content is stored securely.
