A BIG HELLO to all our Students, Parents and Friends of St Matthew's,

We as a Staff at St Matthew's were expecting, as you probably were too, that we (Students & Staff) would all return hopefully together in Term 4, but unfortunately it is not to be. It is what it is and as we have done already we will work to the best of our abilities to work through this. I know we all are looking forward to the school holidays so that we can all (Students, Parents and Staff) have a break from Distance Learning. There is less than two weeks to go so hang in there. As I said at an Assembly a few weeks ago, "Let's not worry about the things we can't do, but enjoy the things we can."

Please find below the latest correspondence and update from the Executive Director of Catholic Education Melbourne. It is a summary of what the Premier Daniel Andrews stated on Sunday:

"The Victorian Government has released its plan for easing coronavirus (COVID-19) restrictions. It includes the following decisions about school operations. All schools will continue to provide remote and flexible learning for the remainder of Term 3, except specialist schools in rural and regional Victoria, consistent with current settings. These changes remain subject to the advice of Victoria's Chief Health Officer:

First week of Term 4, 5–9 October

Remote and flexible learning will continue for all students, except in specialist schools in rural and regional Victoria.

Onsite supervision for children of permitted workers and vulnerable students will continue to be provided consistent with existing guidelines.

Schools in Metropolitan Melbourne from 12 October – return to onsite learning

Students in Prep to Grade 2 return to full-time onsite schooling. The existing remote learning program will not continue for these year levels. Remote and flexible learning will continue for all students in Grade 3 to Year 10, other than for children of permitted workers and vulnerable students.

Dates to be confirmed, subject to health advice

All students from Grade 3 to Year 10 in Metropolitan Melbourne will continue with remote and flexible learning. A date for the return of these year levels to face-to-face learning will be subject to further health advice. During the staged return, Outside School Hours Care will be available to students attending for on-site supervision and progressively for the relevant year levels returning to on-site learning.

Term 4 onsite arrangements – school staff

School staff will be required to attend school at times when they are delivering onsite learning or supervision, including the allocation of additional classes as required consistent with the current agreement. At all other times, they should continue to work remotely where possible.

Further guidance for schools

The following will be provided to schools later this week:

- communication materials for parents and carers, including advice on the benefit for almost all students in remaining with their age-peer group
- guidance on priorities for Term 4, including changes to administrative tasks normally undertaken in Term 4 and reporting student learning attainment.

This next stage of school operations both contributes to the continuing efforts to reduce the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) and maximises the learning of our students. It requires again the flexibility, adaptability and resilience that have been demonstrated so well by our schools, which has been recognised by parents and carers in our Catholic school communities. Further consultation is also occurring with the Department of Education and Training on Semester 2 assessment and reporting expectations.

I look forward to providing you with the materials referenced above as soon as possible in order to provide clarity about the term ahead, and to indicate the support that will be available."

EPIC BOOKS

Most teachers at St Matthew have allowed their students access to Epic School during school hours— Monday through Friday, 7 am to 4 pm —using just the class code.There is free access to thousands of high-quality books loved by students grade 6 and under, including grade-specific, high-interest topics across languages and genres.

However, EPIC has changed its availability for students outside of school hours.

Students now have access to Epic Free after 4 pm, Monday through Friday, and on weekends for up to **2 hours every week**. The time limit resets every Monday so that students can enjoy after-school reading every week and fulfil their daily 20-minute reading goals. The selection of books is limited and does not include audiobooks and learning videos.

There is no option for a school subscription to extend this availability and parents will need to pay a subscription for an extended use of EPIC for more than 2 hours weekly. If your children are already using Remote Student Access, there will be no change to how they log in. Parents should visit **www.getepic.com/sign-in** and enter the same parent email and password that was used to set up their Parent account. It is important to recognize that you will have access to the complete reading history, but a smaller library of books than you did with Remote Student Access.



SUNSHINE ONLINE

The school pays for an annual subscription to Sunshine Online. You do not need to pay or subscribe. Sunshine Online is a digital literacy program. It has been designed to help children aged 4 to 10+ learn to read and develop the skills needed for continuing reading independence and success. The program also uses maths stories to develop skills and understandings in early numeracy.

Sunshine Online features over 650 ebooks (most of them animated) along with 1000 fun, interactive activities and games. Students are engaged and don't even know they are learning. They are just having fun! Each student is able to work at their own pace and at an appropriate level with success and achievement being the motivation for more!

The teachers may suggest that your children focus on a particular easy or instructional level and complete the follow-up activities after each ebook.



MRS PENGELLY'S VIRTUAL LIBRARY

A place where you can sit back and enjoy listening to stories! Mrs Pengelly is regularly adding links and stories to her library, so make sure you keep checking. If there is a story attached to a book, you will see a hand displayed..... otherwise it's coming soon!

WUSHKA

In the coming weeks and Term 4, some teachers may be trialling a new cloud-based school digital reading program called Wushka.

Teachers can set Readers for homework and students can continue to read after school 24/7.

The reading boxes are carefully levelled and have highlighted text and narration, useful for guided reading. A student's classroom teacher selects appropriate reading levels, reading groups and school readers for both school and home, ensuring students progress at the appropriate pace and build strong reading skills. The extensive selection of over 600 fiction and non-fiction levelled readers are stored in Wushka's coloured digital reading boxes. Every levelled reader is supported by an online comprehension quiz and printable teacher support material including lesson plans and assessment and progress tracking. Teachers can easily manage and track reading groups for at school, and at-home reading.

Couples from regional areas may find this option ideal.




