#### Texting is quick...


... and perfect for passing on jokes, today's photo or interesting quotes. Get your grandkids to show you how to include emojis and gifs to take it up a level.

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Pope Francis has proclaimed the First World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, to be held on Sunday 25 July 2021 (Feast of Sts Anne & Joachim, grandparents to Jesus).

In announcing this, Pope Francis has chosen the theme "I am with you always" (cf. Mt 28:20) to express the closeness of the Lord and the Church to every older person, especially in these challenging pandemic times.

This promise of closeness and hope is one that can be shared by young and old alike. Not only are young people called upon to be present in the lives of grandparents and older people, but the elderly also have a mission - to pass on their faith.

Each of us, whether married or single, religious or priest, share this mission. Let's reflect on the particular ways in which this is lived out by grandparents and the elderly.

#### THE OLDER GENERATION: THEY'VE 'SEEN IT ALL BEFORE'

In the confusion of a pandemic, older people are the ones with the longest experience of unpredictable and challenging times. They are survivors whose experiences often include migration, war, droughts, bushfires, financial recessions, business failures, to name just some. They can provide perspective in the face of uncertainty.



#### Dear Families,

Over the last number of weeks, it has come to the attention of our classroom teachers and through discussions in meetings that many of our students are not sleeping well. Many are spending a lot of time on their devices at night after parents have gone to bed. Some have even boasted in class of how long they have stayed awake, one who said they were up till 4 AM. These children come into class exceptionally tired, can be very grumpy and often can lash out about the simplest of things. These reactions and lack of resilience in the children is something that can affect them for a long time even after they have left school.

It is important that you are aware that your child is going to bed at a reasonable time and is actually falling asleep without the TV on in their bedroom or any devices too.

- At 5-11 years, children need **9-11 hours' sleep** a night. For example, if your child wakes for school at 7 am and needs approximately 10 hours sleep per night, your child should be in bed before 9 pm.
- Some children fall deeply asleep very quickly when they go to bed. Others sleep lightly, fidgeting and muttering for up to 20 minutes, before getting into deep sleep.
- Children have different kinds of sleep during the night. The first few hours of sleep are usually the deepest. Most dreams happen in the second half of the night.

As adults, we know that if we do not have a great sleep at night then we too can have a tough day ahead and not feel well. It is the same for the children – we need to make sure that they have the best night sleep to help their learning.

## CYBER SAFETY

In the world that we live in today, children are extremely connected to technology and devices. For this reason, as adults we need to be on top of what games, apps and social networking our children are using.

Our leading experts in this field offer the following tips to enable our children to be responsible, respectful and happy when they are online.

## TIPS FOR CHILDREN

- Know who you are talking to and playing games with
- Keep your password private.
- Whatever is posted online can never be removed be careful what you post.
- Speak to a trusted adult when concerned about anything online. TIPS FOR ADULTS
- Limit the time children spend on technology
- Ensure they are in a room where they can be heard and seen
- Know what apps and games your children are playing, as well as who they are playing with Please see the attached poster about different ways to keep safe online.

It is important that we are not taking technology off our children but helping them navigate technology safely.


